Adherence to The Meridian School's official school uniform policy is a key factor in building up a proud tradition in the school's life. Pride in appearance and in wearing the correct clothing is an important part of building up our school's profile.

We believe the wearing of school uniform:

contributes to school unity

develops a sense of belonging

encourages pride in the school

reduces competitive dressing

develops a positive image of The Meridian School in the wider community

assists with the safety and care of students by identifying them while on excursions

The wearing of the uniform is regarded as a core behavior issue. If a student is unable to wear the school uniform on a particular day, they must have a written note from their parent/guardian. Persistent breach of the uniform policy by a student, without appropriate note from parent, may result in restricted play, exclusion from recreational activities or exclusion from any activities in which students are representing the school in the wider community e.g. field trips.
